The 22nd anniversary of Khwopa Engineering College and the 15th anniversary of Khwopa College of Engineering celebrations concluded amid a grand ceremony along with a cultural program on Friday, 29 Mangsir, in the college premises. Chief guest Prem Suwal, Secretary of Nepal Workers and



Peasants Party, said that the party has been contributing to the production of manpower for the country since colleges, along with Khwopa Secondary School, were established emphasizing education in 2056 B.S. Stating that if the skilled manpower in the technical sector cannot be provided with employment opportunities in Nepal there is a possibility that this manpower will also go abroad, he affirmed the country has reached a chaotic situation because of lack of farsightedness in the Prime Ministers and Ministers.

Stating that the Prime Ministers and Ministers should not only focus on the development of their districts but also pay attention to the overall development of the country, chief guest Suwal remarked the natural resources of Nepal are being captured by Indian monopoly capital and expansionist policies. He opined that it is in the interest of the country to abolish the Gorkha recruitment center immediately. Mentioning that along with the increase in population in the federal capital

Kathmandu, water scarcity, pollution, traffic jams and crime numbers are increasing, he stressed the government has to establish well managed cities in different districts for the balanced development of the country. Taking the view that Nepal should show solidarity with the Palestinian people, he said the brutal killing and war crimes committed by Israel against Palestine, with the support of America, should end as soon as possible. He further clarified Israel is being presented as a puppet of America today.

Chairman of the program Sunil Prajapati, Mayor of Bhaktapur municipality and Chairman of college management committee said along with the implementation of federalism as per the constitution of Nepal, Bhaktapur municipality is working towards socialism according to the spirit of the constitution. He said that due to the lack of coordination



between the federal, provincial and local levels, many problems are also being faced, and the government is not able to work for the benefit of the people, and now there is a demand to find an alternative to the republic. He expressed his hope that Khwopa University Bill will be passed by the Parliament this year while adding Bhaktapur is the first municipality in the country to provide higher education to poor families by giving educational loans. He clarified that the municipality has advanced the policy of educational loans to fulfill the declared policy of building a civilized and civilized society by intellectualizing the society.

Member of Bagmati Provincial Assembly Srijana Sainju stated that the contribution of the colleges run by Bhaktapur municipality in the field of engineering is unparalleled and said that even in adverse times, these colleges are operating as centers of hope for the country by producing skilled people needed for the country. Stating that the



education sector of the country has been destroyed by the policy of privatization and commercialization, she said the attack on Palestine by Israel is a war crime against humanity.

Deputy Mayor of Bhaktapur Municipality Rajni Joshi said the aim of the municipality to intellectualize the society is gradually being fulfilled and added the concept of 'one house and one graduate' has also helped it. She insisted that Bhaktapur Municipality is preparing qualified citizens for the country by operating colleges of various subjects to strengthen the world of education and emphasized that the students studying here should be citizens of the country. 

KhEC Faculty Member Represents at Symposium of the Asia Heritage Network

Ar. Pramila Shilpakar, a faculty member at Khwopa Engineering College (KhEC), participated in the 3rd Symposium of the Asia Heritage Network, which took place from December 1st to December 3rd, 2023. The event brought together 70 participants from diverse Asian countries, including Japan, Malaysia, Indonesia, China, Thailand, Mongolia, Myanmar, Korea, and Nepal.

Hosted at the historic Bahadur Shah Hall in Patan, a UNESCO World Heritage site, the symposium was organized by the Kathmandu Valley Preservation Trust (KVPT) Nepal and the Nara Machizukuri Centre (NMC), Japan. Its primary goals were to identify hidden historic tangible and intangible heritages while fostering stronger social ties among Asian nations.

The diverse program included a heritage walk in the historic town of Patan, a workshop visit focusing on wood crafts and hand tools, and a tour of the Jyapu Ethnic Museum in Chyasal. The immersive

experience featured a traditional Newari feast accompanied by traditional music, providing a vivid showcase of the region's rich intangible heritage.

On the second day, representatives from China. Indonesia, Mongolia, Thailand, Myanmar, Malaysia, Korea, and Japan presented reports at Bahadur Shah Hall. The third day featured a pilot project on Nan-yin music by the Quanzhou group from China and a session from Nepal addressing the challenges and threats faced by living crafts. The symposium served as a valuable platform for experts to exchange insights and experiences in the preservation and promotion of cultural heritage.

Ar. Pramila Shilpakar expressed enthusiasm about sharing the gained knowledge with colleagues and students at the college. She looks forward to applying these learnings in her professional practices, further enriching both her teaching and contribution to heritage preservation initiatives.
